Tecumseh (1768? – 1813)

_____ Moved with his brother Tenskwatawa (“The Prophet”) to Prophetstown (in present-day Indiana).

_____ W.H. Harrison negotiated Treaty of Fort Wayne giving 3 million acres of Indian land to the U.S.

_____ Battle of Tippecanoe ended Prophet’s leadership.

_____ Joined British Gen. Brock to force surrender of Detroit.

_____ After surrendering to Harrison, was killed by future Vice President, Col. Richard Johnson.

Lucretia Mott (1793 – 1880)

_____ Married James Mott.

_____ Moved to Philadelphia and became known for her speeches against slavery.

_____ Spoke at International Anti-Slavery Convention in London, one of only six female delegates.

_____ Attended Seneca Falls Convention on women’s rights.

_____ Published *Discourse on Woman*.

_____ With other Quakers, founded Swarthmore College.

_____ Elected President of American Equal Rights Assn.

Sojourner Truth (1797 – 1883)

_____ Born Isabella Baumfree into slavery in New York state.

_____ Ran away from her master shortly before New York’s law abolishing slavery took effect.

_____ After religious conversion, became a preacher.

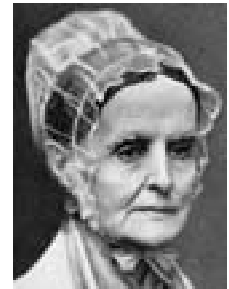
_____ Changed her name to Sojourner Truth.

_____ Biography *The Narrative of Sojourner Truth: A Northern Slave* published by William Lloyd Garrison.

_____ Gave her most famous speech, “Ain’t I a Woman,” at Ohio Woman’s Rights Convention.

_____ Met with the president at the White House.

Robert E. Lee (1807 – 1870)

- _____ Supervised engineering work for St. Louis harbor.
- _____ Distinguished himself in the Mexican-American War.
- _____ Became superintendent of West Point.
- _____ Captured John Brown at Harpers Ferry, Virginia.
- _____ Resigned from U.S. Army; took command of Confederate forces in Virginia.
- _____ Surrenders his army to U.S. Grant.
- _____ Became president of Washington College.

Jefferson Davis (1808 – 1889)

- _____ Two older brothers served in Battle of New Orleans.
- _____ Graduated from West Point one year ahead of Lee.
- _____ Married Zachary Taylor's daughter, Sarah.
- _____ Elected to U.S. House of Representatives.
- _____ Married Varina Howell.
- _____ Fought bravely at Battle of Buena Vista.
- _____ Elected to U.S. Senate.
- _____ Served as Secretary of War.
- _____ Inaugurated as President of the Confederate States.
- _____ Captured by Union forces; begins two years in prison.

Frederick Douglass (1818? – 1895)

- _____ While a slave, taught to read by his master's wife.
- _____ Successfully escaped from slavery to New York.
- _____ Inspired by William Lloyd Garrison, gave his first anti-slavery speech.
- _____ Published his first autobiography, *Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass, an American Slave*.
- _____ Fearful of arrest as co-conspirator of John Brown, fled to Canada.
- _____ Met with the president concerning the treatment of black soldiers in the Union army.
- _____ Became first African American to be nominated for vice president (Equal Rights Party).
- _____ Married Helen Pitts, a white feminist.
- _____ Served as minister to the Republic of Haiti.

- _____ With Susan B. Anthony, founded the Woman's State Temperance Society.
- _____ With Anthony, founded the American Equal Rights Association.
- _____ Helped draft a petition asking Congress to grant the right to vote without regard to sex or race.
- _____ Published *The History of Woman Suffrage* (Volume 1).
- _____ Became first president of the North American Women's Suffrage Association.

Clara Barton (1821 – 1912)

- _____ Founded New Jersey's first free public school.
- _____ Permitted to bring medical supplies to Civil War battlefields.
- _____ Helped identify Union dead at Andersonville Prison.
- _____ Joined relief effort during the Franco-Prussian War.
- _____ Became president of the American branch of the International Red Cross.

Sitting Bull (1831– 1890)

- _____ Fought in his first battle against U.S. soldiers.
- _____ Became head chief of the Lakota nation.
- _____ Defeated Custer at the Battle of Little Bighorn.
- _____ Led his followers into Canada to escape U.S. Army.
- _____ Returned to U.S. to surrender.
- _____ While touring with Buffalo Bill's Wild West show, shakes hands with the president.

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
