## U.S. LEADERS GROUP 1 – PART I (#1-24)

Give the number of the president referred to in the clue about the U.S. Leader or the president who was in the White House when the event occurred.

### Tecumseh (1768? – 1813)

- 3 Moved with his brother Tenskwatawa (“The Prophet”) to Prophetstown (in present-day Indiana).
- 4 W.H. Harrison negotiated Treaty of Fort Wayne giving 3 million acres of Indian land to the U.S.
- 4 Battle of Tippecanoe ended Prophet’s leadership.
- 4 Joined British Gen. Brock to force surrender of Detroit.
- 4 After surrendering to Harrison, was killed by future V.P. Col. Richard Johnson.

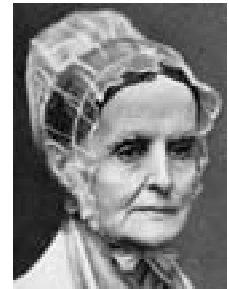
### Lucretia Mott (1793 – 1880)

- 4 Married James Mott.
- 5 Moved to Philadelphia and became known for her speeches against slavery.
- 8 Spoke at International Anti-Slavery Convention in London, one of only six female delegates.
- 11 Attended Seneca Falls Convention on women’s rights.
- 12 Published *Discourse on Woman*.
- 16 With other Quakers, founded Swarthmore College.
- 17 Elected President of American Equal Rights Assn.

### Sojourner Truth (1797 – 1883)

- 1 Born Isabella Baumfree into slavery in New York state.
- 6 Ran away from her master shortly before New York’s law abolishing slavery took effect.
- 7 After religious conversion, became a preacher.
- 10 Changed her name to Sojourner Truth.
- 13 Biography *The Narrative of Sojourner Truth: A Northern Slave* published by William Lloyd Garrison.
- 14 Gave her most famous speech, “Ain’t I a Woman,” at Ohio Woman’s Rights Convention.
- 16 Met with the president at the White House.

Give the number of the president referred to in the clue about the U.S. Leader or the president who was in the White House when the event occurred.

### Robert E. Lee (1807 – 1870)

- 7 Graduated second in his class from West Point.
- 7 Married step-granddaughter of George Washington.
- 8 Supervised engineering work for St. Louis harbor.
- 11 Distinguished himself in the Mexican-American War.
- 13 Became superintendent of West Point.
- 15 Captured John Brown at Harpers Ferry, Virginia.
- 16 Resigned from U.S. Army; took command of Confederate forces in Virginia.
- 16 Surrenders his army to U.S. Grant.
- 17 Became president of Washington College.

### Jefferson Davis (1808 – 1889)

- 4 Two older brothers served in Battle of New Orleans.
- 6 Graduated from West Point one year ahead of Lee.
- 7 Married Zachary Taylor's daughter, Sarah.
- 10 Elected to U.S. House of Representatives.
- 11 Married Varina Howell.
- 11 Fought bravely at Battle of Buena Vista.
- 13 Elected to U.S. Senate.
- 14 Served as Secretary of War.
- 15 Inaugurated as President of the Confederate States.
- 17 Captured by Union forces; begins two years in prison.

### Frederick Douglass (1818? – 1895)

- 7 While a slave, taught to read by his master's wife.
- 8 Successfully escaped from slavery to New York.
- 10 Inspired by William Lloyd Garrison, gave his first anti-slavery speech.
- 10 Published his first autobiography, *Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass, an American Slave*.
- 15 Fearful of arrest as co-conspirator of John Brown, fled to Canada.
- 16 Met with the president concerning the treatment of black soldiers in the Union army.
- 18 Became first African American to be nominated for vice president (Equal Rights Party).
- 21 Married Helen Pitts, a white feminist.
- 23 Served as minister to the Republic of Haiti.

Give the number of the president referred to in the clue about the U.S. Leader or the president who was in the White House when the event occurred.

### Elizabeth Cady Stanton (1815 – 1902)

- 8 Married Henry Stanton and went with him to World Anti-Slavery Convention in London.
- 11 With Lucretia Mott, organized the Seneca Falls Convention on women's rights.
- 14 With Susan B. Anthony, founded the Woman's State Temperance Society.
- 16 With Anthony, founded the American Equal Rights Association.
- 19 Helped draft a petition asking Congress to grant the right to vote without regard to sex or race.
- 20 Published *The History of Woman Suffrage* (Volume 1).
- 23 Became first president of the North American Women's Suffrage Association.

### Clara Barton (1821 – 1912)

- 13 Founded New Jersey's first free public school.
- 16 Permitted to bring medical supplies to Civil War battlefields.
- 17 Helped identify Union dead at Andersonville Prison.
- 18 Joined relief effort during the Franco-Prussian War.
- 20 Became president of the American branch of the International Red Cross.

### Sitting Bull (1831-1890)

- 16 Fought in his first battle against U.S. soldiers.
- 17 Became head chief of the Lakota nation.
- 18 Defeated Custer at the Battle of Little Bighorn.
- 19 Led his followers into Canada to escape U.S. Army.
- 20 Returned to U.S. to surrender.
- 22 While touring with Buffalo Bill's Wild West show, shakes hands with the president.

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
