STXTH ACADEMIC OLYMPIAD HELD IN PENNSYLVANIA MOUNTAINS

The Sixth Annual National Academic Games Olympics met at Seven Springs, Pennsylvania, last April 29 - May 2. Inside the contest rooms, over 200 students from five states created an electric atmosphere with their concentration and intensity as they competed as individuals and teams in a group of games which have been designed by university professors and other subject matter specialists to promote both learning and fun.

Two games -- MR. PRESIDENT and STRANGE BEDFELLOWS -- were new to the Olympics this year. The first requires players to identify an American president on the basis (sometimes misleading) clues; the second game vides quotations which are to be matched with their (sometimes unlikely) authors.

As they had for five years before, players also competed in the by now "traditional" Olympic games: WFF 'N PROOF (which deals with mathematical logic); ON-SETS (set theory); EQUATIONS (mathematics); PROPAGANDA (instructing in the recognition of emotional arguments meant to influence opinion and action); ar AMERICARDS U.S.A. and EURO-CARDS (dealing with United States and European history and geography).

Away from their intellectual jousting, students — and counsellors — could relax and expand in the soft spring greenness of the beautiful Laurel Mountains, or exert themselves in walking those mountains, or let go of some stored-up kinetic energy at the ping-pong tables or in the swimming pool at the Seven Springs Resort, home for the participants and coaches during the contests.

Pennsylvanians Dominate Contests

The hospitality of the Pennsylvania contingents didn't prevent their emergence as the top winners in this year's games. Two Allegheny County, PA, teams took overall championships in their divisions: Hearty congratulations to the Mt. Lebanon High School and the Bethel Park Junior High School teams! Allegheny County did not, however, make a clean sweep of things. Teams and individuals from New Orleans, LA; Ann Arbor, MI; Armstrong County, PA, captured a healthy share of firsts in individual games. And a happy California fivesome carried the overall elementary school trophy back home to Saugus, CAL.
