

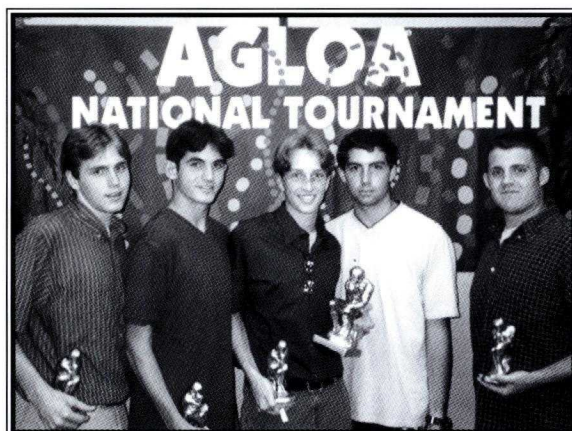

2001 NATIONAL TOURNAMENT A CAJUN TREAT

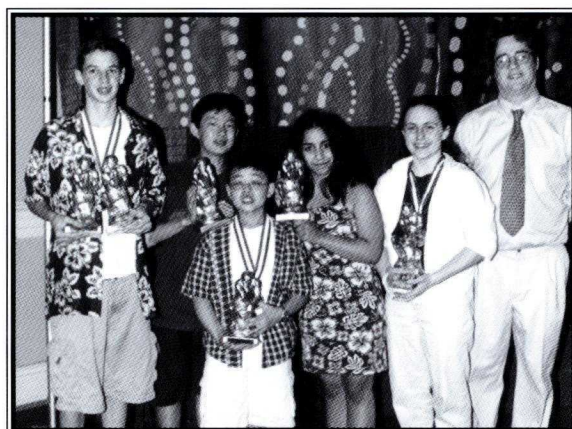
Over 1,000 players, coaches, and parents basked in the hospitality of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, April 27 - 30, to compete in and enjoy the 2001 Academic Games National Tournament. Competitors from over 60 leagues in Michigan, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, North Carolina, Georgia, Florida, and Louisiana did brain battle in the academic areas of Mathematics (EQUATIONS and CON-SETS), Social Studies (PRESIDENTS and WORLD EVENTS), and Language Arts (LINGUISTICS and PROPAGANDA) for four days. Most groups visited New Orleans attractions either before or after the tournament.

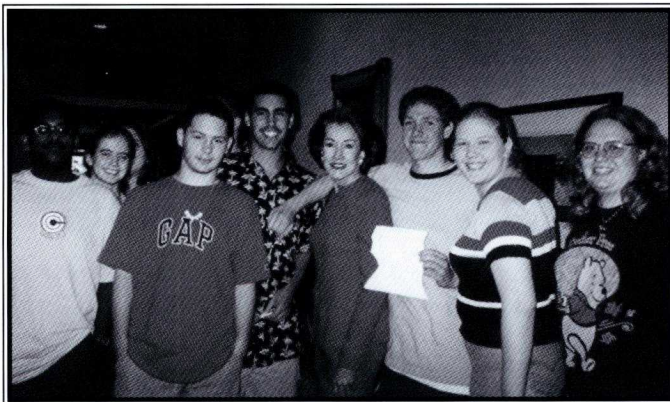

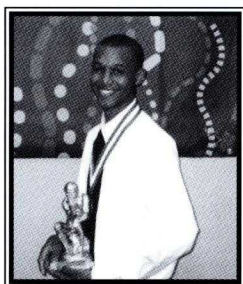

CIRCUIT COURT ARBITRATOR SHARES DREAMS, INSPIRES HOPE

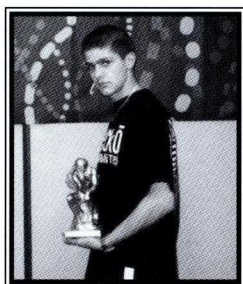
Vic Chandhok, tied for the 5th most individual national Academic Games championships in history, made a guest appearance at the 2001 National Tournament. An Academic Games star at Mt Lebanon School District near Pittsburgh, PA, from 1972-77, Mr. Chandhok was a nine-time individual national titlist, as well as a member of more than ten national team champions. He took a break from his position as Circuit Court (for Texas, Louisiana, and Mississippi) arbitrator to read PROPAGANDA examples to the High School Divisions and reveal his takes on the persuasion techniques.

During the week, Mr. Chandhok, a family man and resident of New Orleans, handles major arbitrations among businesses and individuals whose legal issues have risen to the national Circuit Court level. As a guest reader for the AGLOA tournament, he shared many memorable Academic Games experiences with today's competitors. He revealed the critical role that Academic Games team competition had played in his personal growth and in preparation for his successful legal career. The 2001 players were duly impressed and appreciative of his presence.

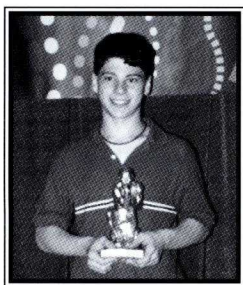

2002 NATIONAL TOURNAMENT WILL BE IN CHARLOTTE, NORTH CAROLINA

The 2002 Academic Games National Tournament -- Race to Charlotte -- will take place April 25 - 28, in Charlotte, North Carolina. Players and coaches will arrive on April 25 for registration. Awards ceremonies will be conducted in the evening of April 28. Over 1,000 participants are expected. Events, activities, and announcements will feature a NASCAR-style auto racing theme for which the Charlotte area is famous.

Students, coaches, and parents will be housed and will play in two different hotels right next to one another. High School Divisions will stay and play in the Charlotte Hilton Executive Park. Elementary and Middle Divisions will stay and play in the Charlotte Marriott Executive Park.

Several activities are being planned by the AGLOA Board, including a Saturday evening trip to the Carowinds Amusement Park. Full registration information will be mailed to existing league coordinators and other interested parties in early December 2001. If your school is new to AGLOA, please contact AGLOA to receive the registration information.

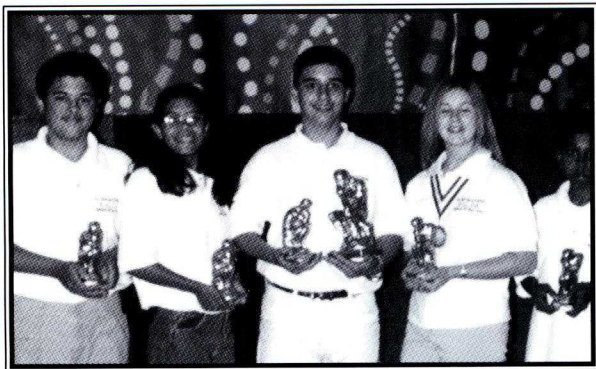

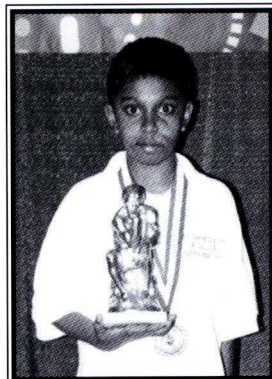
World Events Current Events Year 2001 only

This theme is limited to the United States space program. However, the actions of other nations which impacted the U.S. space program may be included in questions.

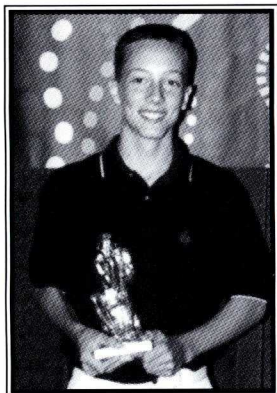
1. Famous people, including early pioneers, scientists, astronauts.

6. Inventions and commercial applications, including food, entertainment, medical.



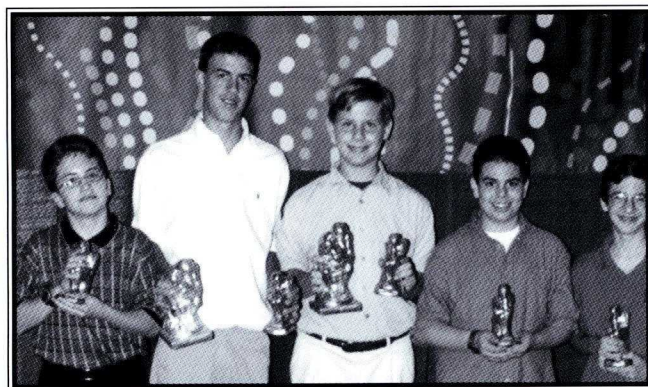

YEAR 2001 OUTSTANDING EDUCATORS

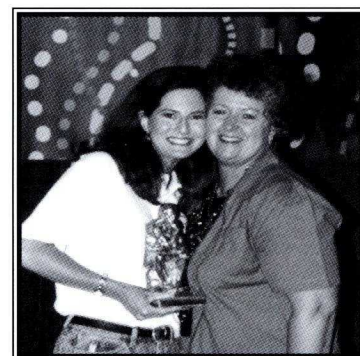

C. Who was President of the United States when Reconstruction began following the Civil War?

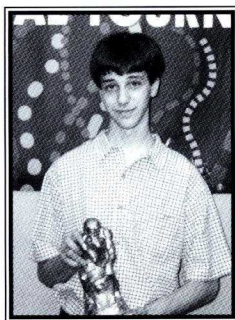

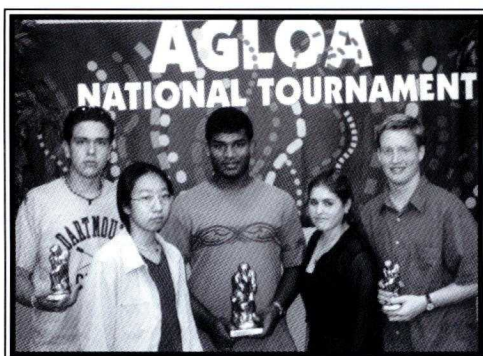

E. What is Al Gore's home state which voted Republican causing him to lose the election

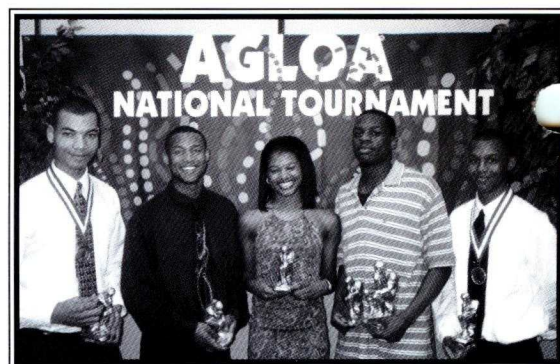
