American Museum of Science and Engineering

The American Museum of Science and Engineering is owned by the United States Department of Energy and managed under Oak Ridge National Laboratory. The museum originally opened in 1949 under the name American Museum of Atomic Energy, in an old wartime cafeteria. In 1975 the museum moved to their current location and in 1978 the American Museum of Atomic Energy changed its name to the American Museum of Science and Engineering.
