Coaches Corner: Presidents

One way to help students prepare for Presidents is to make them do most of the work. Before you accuse me of being the reincarnation of Simon Legree, let me explain.

Assign each student one or more presidents from the range being studied (such as 25-45). You can combine students from Elementary and Middle or Junior and Senior for this preparation.

Give each student an outline sheet for each president that student is assigned. The student will fill in basic information about the various aspects of the president's life: Early years, education, career before entering politics, marriage and family, as well as his political career and presidency, and, finally, his life after the presidency. You can add a section on the theme for the year; e.g. Cabinet Members for 2018-19.

Depending on the amount of preparation time before the tournament, you can have each student "present" his president to the group. Give each player the same blank information sheet you gave the presenter so they can fill in the information as their teammate makes the presentation.

If preparation time is limited, you can duplicate the completed sheet for each president for each player. Or players can exchange their information in small groups (for example, all players with a common lunch period or all who can meet before school).

Also have each player submit five clues about each president they were assigned. Then compile the clues into a practice round where you throw out a clue and ask for the president.

I ask coaches of Presidents, Theme, or Current Events to share preparation techniques that have worked well. I'll include your suggestions in future bulletins and give you credit.

Cube Game Judges
