- 33 U.S. delegate to UN General Assembly. 46-7-50
- 34 Chief architect of SEATO. 1954
- 34 Opposes Anglo-French takeover of Suez Canal.

### Sandra Day O’Connor (1930 – )

- 33 Graduates from Stanford Law School. 1952
- 37 Begins serving in Arizona State Senate. 1969
- 38 Elected judge of Maricopa County Superior Court.
- 39 Appointed to Arizona Court of Appeals. 1979
- 40 Confirmed as Justice of Supreme Court. 1981
- 43 Retires from Supreme Court. 2005
